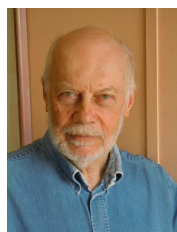

Since 2009 he has been working as Head of Industry and International Promotion for the Polish T-Mobile New Horizons IFF in Wrocław, where he helped putting together co-production markets and events such as Polish Days, New Horizons Studio, and US in Progress Wrocław (at the American Film Festival). He also works as a matchmaker for the Connecting Cottbus market and runs a Warsaw-based boutique sales company New Europe Film Sales, which sells short films and art-house feature films. Jan is a graduate of Wajda Film School and 2013 EAVE European Producers Workshop participant.

David Graham, Attentional, UK: Presentation of the MEDIA study on audiences

David formed Attentional in 1990 to develop data and research services for independent TV and film producers in the UK. David's media career began in Toronto, Canada and continued in the UK, at the BBC, where David was a producer in the Current Affairs department of BBC Network Television. In 1980, David founded Diverse Production Limited, an independent production company, which supplied current affairs programmes to Channel Four. Since its founding in 1990 Attentional has focused on three areas of work: audiences, media policy and scientific data derived from neurosciences and evolutionary psychology. The last activity, designed to discover what drives attention to entertainment, is based in Los Angeles, California. Attentional is currently presenting a new phase of this work to interested parties and clients.

David was educated at the Universities of Bristol and Indiana. He is a member of The Royal Television Society and has been awarded a medal for Outstanding Services to Television. Seneit Debese, Debese Film, Germany: a new audience for cinema: the visually impaired persons and hard of hearing persons

Seneit Debese has been working in film distribution for the last 13 years at zoomfilm.de, venusfilm verleih and Neue Visionen Filmverleih GmbH, where she gained considerable insights into both the German and international film

markets. This experience, together with her degree in economics in 2003, are behind debese.film, which was established in 2011 as a film distribution company. Film distribution remains at the core of the company's remit.

Our innovative idea of making a player available to provide a barrier-free cinema experience has potential for audiences all over Europe and beyond. This service can be made available to distributors of cinema films, owners of cinemas and the more than 31,5 million people in Europe with sensory impairments, facilitating more free access for blind and hearing-impaired people. In this project, she encourages enthusiasm for the cinema experience by helping to provide access to this way of viewing films, making going to the cinema a viable option for people who might not otherwise go. In 2003, for example, she introduced the idea of "Wickeltaschenkino" (cinema for parents of small children, named after the word for nappy bags in German).

The debese.film team relishes the challenge of making all of the films in cinemas easily accessible to all, broadening audiences' horizons while also enlarging cinema audiences.

Dan Light, Glasseye Inc: How to optimize your marketing campaign online?

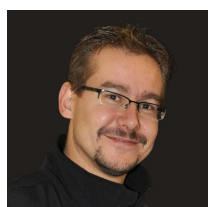

Andreas Baumann, Drei Freunde, Germany: collaboration between distributor and cinemas on Facebook Premieres.

Born in 1970, Andreas Baumann studied visual design at the University of Design in Schwäbisch Gmünd and reached the degree of a Diplom-Designer (FH). In 1998 he began to work as a projectionist in cinemas.

In 2000 Baumann became the Technical Manager of Heinz Lochmann's Traumpalast cinema in Waiblingen (near Stuttgart).

Further he graduated as a secondary school teacher in media technology and design. In 2007 Baumann took over the theatrical management of the Sternenpalast Biberach, since 2010 he also took over the regional management for Lochmann's Passage Kino in Hamburg.

Today Andreas Baumann works as the head of marketing for the Lochmann Filmtheaterbetriebe and is also the General Manager for Marketing & Distribution for the German distribution company drei-freunde Filmverleih, which also belongs to Heinz Lochmann.

Anne Pouliquen, Distingo, France: tools for a successful collaboration between distributors and exhibitors

Anne Pouliquen has worked for independent distributors since 2003 and was graduated from the Femis Distribution department in 2006. From 2007 to 2012, she was the chief representative of DIRE, french union of independent distributors. During this period, she was member of various commissions as the BLOC. She created in 2008 the CIN (association of independents for the digital roll-out) and the group Direct in 2010, an economic interest grouping gathering about 20 french independent distributors. She also organizes since 2009 the congress of Dire gathering 200 distributors and exhibitors during Les Arcs Film festival and provides courses in the Femis distribution department, the Sorbonne and professional training.

In February 2012, she has created her own consulting company, Distinguo, in order to accompany distributors in the development of their profession.

She currently develops a project of communal tools between independent distributors and exhibitors.

SCREENINGS & FESTIVAL EVENTS

Screenings:

To see movies in selection, you don't need to withdraw tickets, but it is recommended to arrive before the screening (not last-minute), especially in the following venues: La Sala, L'Altra Sala and the Rialto, which have a lower number of seats.

Open-air screenings on the Piazza Grande:

There are some well situated seats dedicated to Industry professionals on this place, but it is highly recommended to **arrive at least 20 minutes before the screening** to secure your seat. Otherwise, you will have to be seated at the back of the place with the general audience.

Industry screenings:

All the industry screenings take place in the Rialto (see map below - n°7). You can also access press screenings with your industry accreditation. Press screenings take place at the Kursaal. There are no festival shuttles to go there, but it is a 7-10 min. walk from the Piazza Grande.

To reach Locarno from the airport

The easiest way to arrive in Locarno by plane is to fly to the **Milano Malpensa** airport. If you arrive at Milano Malpensa, a shuttle will drive you to the center of the festival (note that you were asked to book your shuttle in advance).

The shuttle will arrive on the Piazza Grande. From there, you will be able to go to your hotel or go directly to get your accreditation badge.

Accreditation: where to pick up your badge?

Your badge will be available for pick-up at the **Sopracenerina (accreditation desk)**. It is located on the Piazza Grande, behind the Post-Office, right by the big cinema screen.

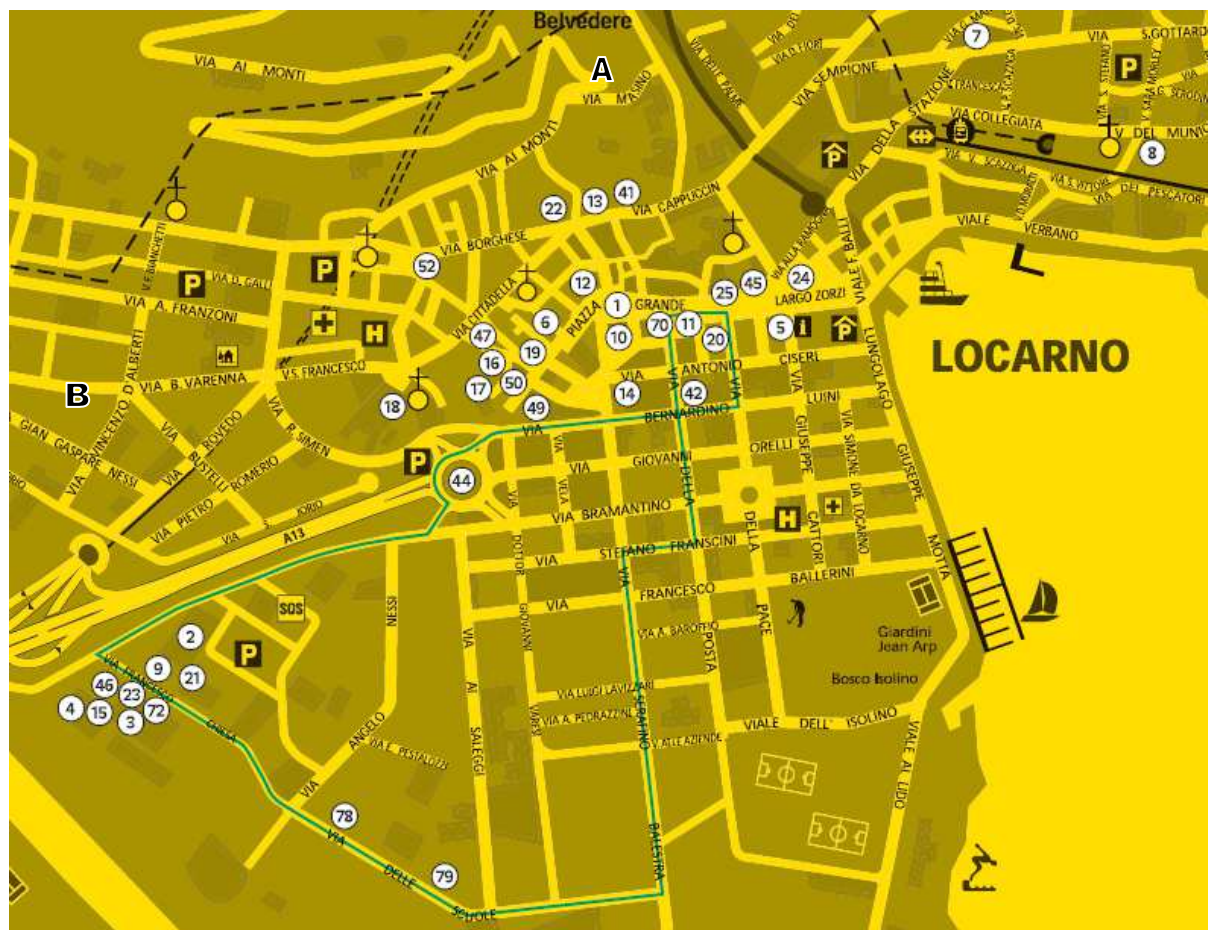

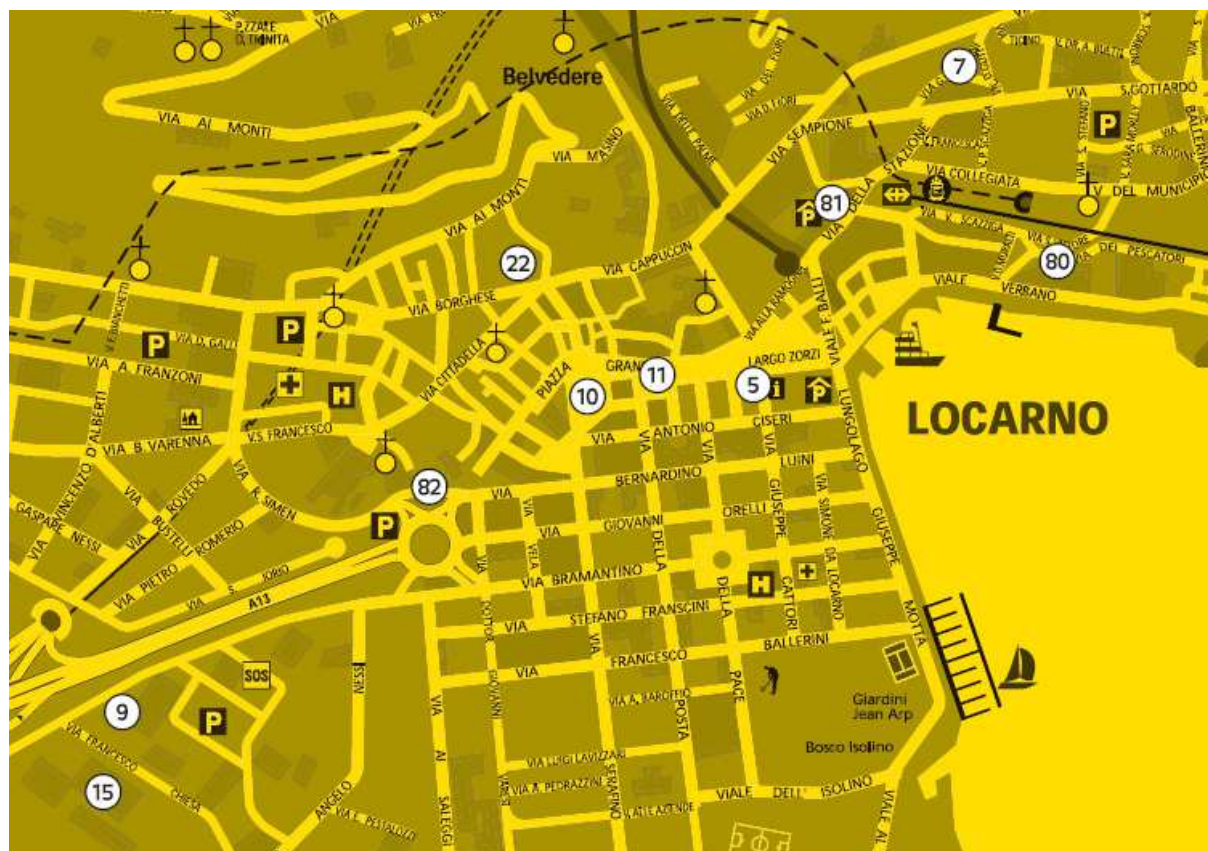

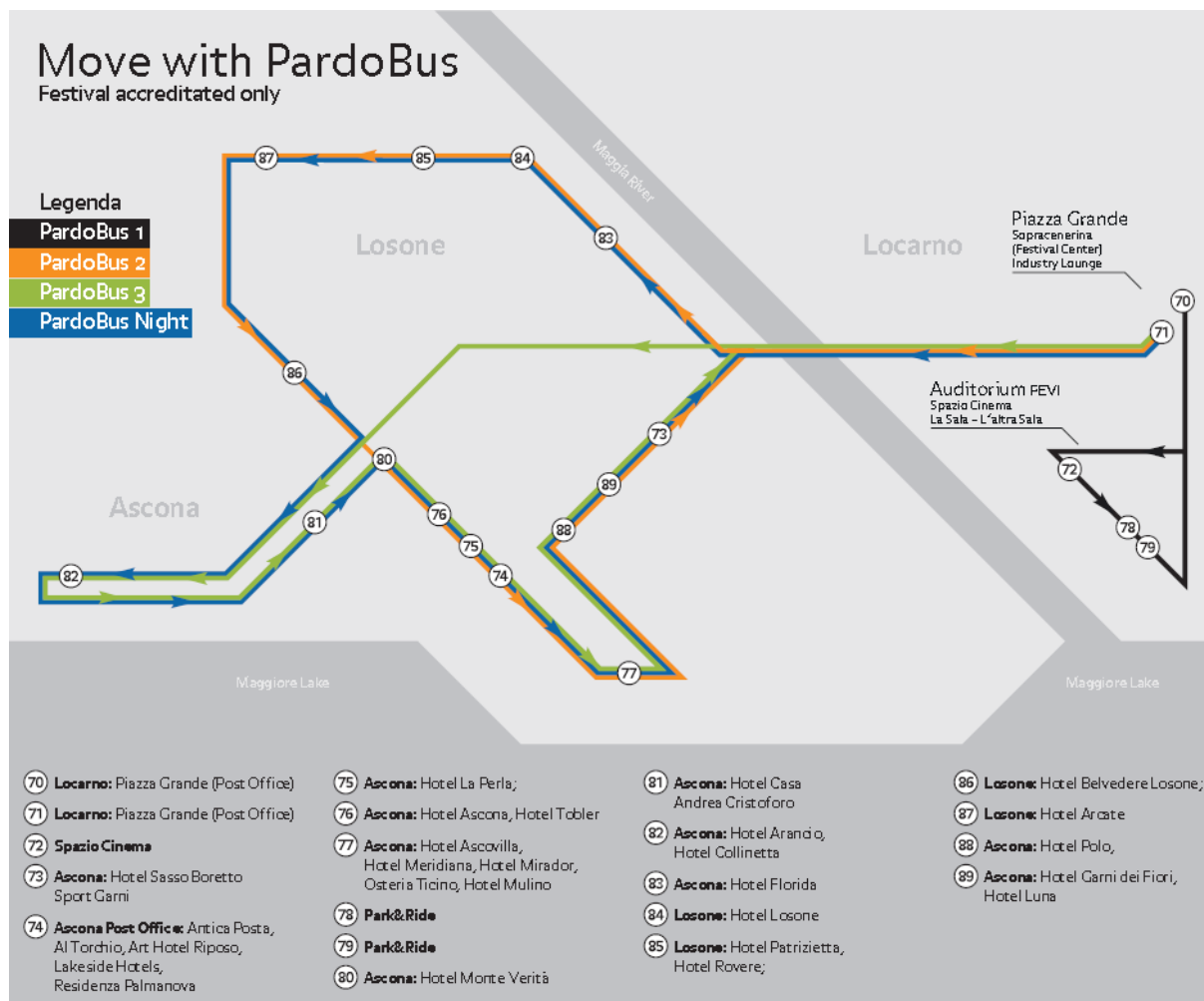
