"The Holy Grail" of right holders: The availability and visibility of European films on VoD platforms

It is not always easy for independent distributors to have their independent and European films defended at best on VoD platforms. While DVDs were important in the life of a film, with distributors having control on their publishing and marketing – it is not yet the case with VoD releases. This is of course a concern and a key topic for independent distributors as none of them wants to see their films disappear from the radar once they have left the theatres.

The industry is active to solve this problematic and there are several answers making their way to enforce the availability and visibility of European and independent films online today, to ensure their circulation and diversity on all platforms.

At an institutional level, the AVMS directive and more specifically the quotas and the prominence tools will hopefully help, and with this workshop, we would like to create a discussion between professionals and institutional experts.

The panel will bring together different experts to have a look at what is the situation of the availability and visibility of European films online today, what is helping - including the directive- and where we could head in the future. It will be followed by a closed session on Tuesday morning with the distributors members of Europa Distribution.







Founder, SampoMedia (UK)

Michael Gubbins is co-founder of the analysis and consultancy company SampoMedia and project leader of a major creative cluster development in the West Midlands of the UK. He was chair of film fund, Ffilm Cymru Wales until early 2019.

Gubbins was editor of titles, including Screen International and Screen Daily, and Music Week in a 25-year career in newspapers and magazines. He writes influential reports on the changing media and cultural environment in Europe; and is a sought-after and experienced moderator, keynote speaker and organiser of conferences, think tanks and events around the world. In the last six years, Gubbins has worked in more than 30 countries with clients interested in the changing on-demand, always-on converged economy. He is an Honorary Visiting Fellow of the University of Exeter, a member of the West Midlands Film Bureau, and sits on the advisory boards of Power to the Pixel and Met Film School.

He then worked as a production assistant and press attaché in the Luxemburgish film production company Amour Fou, before moving to London to join the independent film distributor and exhibitor Curzon Artificial Eye, where he has been working for one year now as business affairs & finance executive.

Director, Peccadillo Pictures (UK)

Kahloon joined Peccadillo in 2003, he started working in the press department and has moved up to head of marketing and is in general the overall distribution manager of the whole company. Kahloon devises the publicity and marketing campaigns and works with media agencies and media owners to secure media slots. Peccadillo was awarded a "Highly Commended" at the 2014 Screen Awards for innovative campaign for the theatrical release of *Stranger by the Lake*. In 2013 campaign for *Our Children* was nominated for Best Foreign Language campaign and in 2012 *Weekend* was nominated for best theatrical campaign in the Screen Awards.

Peccadillo has twice been nominated as Distributor of the Year as a result of Kahloon's marketing campaigns. Our campaign for *Embrace of the Serpent* won the Screen Award for Best Specialist Campaign of the year and Peccadillo nominated for 2016 Screen Award for the campaign for *The Levelling*.
